
Community Literacy of Ontario (CLO)




Milestones & Culminating Tasks

Provincial Support Organizations for Literacy (PSOL), Learning Networks of Ontario (LNO)

During 2024-25 fiscal, most regional networks and provincial support organizations created new milestones and culminating tasks to supplement what is currently in use by the field. These are used for ongoing and exit assessments in LBS.

- 24 new milestones created
- 37 new culminating tasks created











Developing "Mid-Level" Milestones in Level 1

- Each document breaks a Level 1
 Task Group into two levels: Level 1A
 and Level 1B
- These are draft documents meant to provide guidance only.

Communicate Ideas and Information

Complete and Create Documents Level 1 Breakdown

evel 1A

Description

At this level, learners can make very straightforward entries to complete extremely simple documents. They create documents with minimal information that are used in everyday situations and are highly familiar.

Performance Descriptors

To complete documents, the learner:

- · Makes a direct match between what is requested and what is entered.
- Uses familiar vocabulary for entries.

To create documents, the learner:

- · Follows conventions to display information in very simple lists and labels
- Organizes information to suit basic purposes.
- Includes titles where necessary.
- Uses labels and headings to organize very minimal content
- Presents text and numbers in simple lists.

Scope of Task

- . Involves one very simple document up to half a page in length.
- Requires very few entries with clearly labeled fields.
- Entries use highly familiar vocabulary.
- Context is highly familiar and concrete.
 Purpose is very explicit and simple.
- Documents may require entering a few words or phrases.

xample Tasks

- Complete a simple personal information form: Enter name, address, and phone number on a form.
- . Write a "to do" list: List 3-5 tasks to be completed in a day.
- . Create a basic label: Label a folder or a file with a title.
- . Write a cheque: Fill in the date, payee, amount, and signature on a cheque.

Level 1B

Description

At this level, learners can complete documents that are slightly more detailed and create documents that organize a bit more information. The tasks are still straightforward but may involve handling slightly more content and using it in practical, day-to-day contexts.

Performance Descriptors

To complete documents, the learner:

- · Makes a direct match between what is requested and what is entered.
- · Uses familiar but slightly broader vocabulary for entries.

To create documents, the learner:

- · Follows conventions to display information in lists, labels, simple forms, and signs.
- · Organizes lists to suit the purpose more effectively.
- Includes titles and uses headings to organize content.
- · Presents text and numbers below headings in more structured lists.

Scope of Task

- · Involves one document up to a full page in length.
- Requires a few more entries, but still clearly labeled fields.
- Entries use common and slightly broader vocabulary.
- · Context remains familiar but may be slightly varied.
- Purpose is explicit but may involve a bit more detail
- · Documents may require entering up to one paragraph of text.

Example Tasks

- Record an appointment in an agenda or calendar: Enter date, time, and description of an appointment.
- Create a sign to inform visitors that an elevator is out of order: Include a title, short
 message, and any necessary instructions.
- Complete a slightly more detailed form: Enter personal details along with additional
 information like emergency contacts.
- Write a brief note or message: Compose a short paragraph informing a colleague about a meeting or update.









Assessment Tool Database

MLITSD requires that all LBS learners complete an assessment. This spreadsheet lists assessments that are used and endorsed by LBS organizations across Ontario.

- It can help LBS agencies find and select assessments that will meet the specific needs of their learners.
- It can also be used to onboard new LBS practitioners.

In it, you will find the names of various assessments, some information on how to access the assessment, including training and costs. You will also find information that will help you make decisions and determine the best fit for learners.


LBS Needs Assessment Tool & Video

The LBS-NAT document was created with the intention of providing Adult & Continuing Education administrators and staff with a process for evaluation of any relationships that exist between LBS and credit programing, and for identifying any further actions necessary to increase and deepen that relationship. It is envisioned this tool will be used by LBS programs to develop and enhance service coordination and referrals.

- It is divided into 3 sections: professional coordination, shared vision, and learner success.










Why are we talking about this?

- We've adapted the first 2 sections of the LCAT into a comprehensive educational interview and added training to our business plan this year.




Learning Exploration Tool (LET)

- The LET is a comprehensive educational interview and report template.
- What sets it a part is that it includes a learning challenges pre-screen and background interview. These are from ABEA's Learning Challenges Assessment Tool, Steps 1-2.
- Practitioners only use the pieces of the template they think are relevant to the client/learner.
 - For example, if there's no evidence of learning challenges in the pre-screen, you wouldn't continue with the other background interview/checklists.
 - It can be integrated into your existing tools







The 'Participant Registration Form' is usually the first ministry form completed when a learner enters an LBS program. Below you will find data terms and common descriptions or definitions for each. Mandatory fields (those that must be en the 'Criteria/Specific Questions' column. If the 'Suitability indicator' column is highlighted in blue that data is tracked in CaMS towards the Suitability performance measure. The 'Notes' column includes additional information and the 'Comm specific to each region and organization.


